Woodman Point Wastewater Treatment Plant Odour Improvement Plan

The Water Corporation is committed to achieving significant odour reduction from the Woodman Point Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) at Munster.

The Corporation is working to initially achieve at least a 50% reduction in odours from the plant in the next three years. This is a requirement of the plant's Environmental Operating Licence.

The Water Corporation plans a staged reduction in odours. Stage 1 will cost about \$53 million and will be implemented over the next three years. The work will involve covering the plant process areas producing the strongest odours and treating the odorous gases. The greatest practical odour reduction will be achieved as part of Stage 1. Construction is expected to start in June 2007.

A draft Odour Management Plan for the Woodman Point WWTP prepared by the Water Corporation has been submitted to the Department of Environment and Conservation to gain its views. The plan includes input from the Woodman Point WWTP Community Reference Group, which includes local residents in the vicinity of the plant.

The Water Corporation is seeking submissions on the draft plan prior to it being finalised and submitted to the Department of Environment and Conservation. Submissions to the Water Corporation must be received by Friday 27 October 2006.
